## COSH and all sectors of community are glad to see the enforcement of total ban on alternative smoking products

Smoking (Public Health) (Amendment) Ordinance 2021 has come into effect today (30 April), which prohibits the import, promotion, manufacture, sale and possession for commercial purposes of alternative smoking products (ASPs), including electronic cigarettes, heated tobacco products (HTPs) and herbal cigarettes. Hong Kong Council on Smoking and Health (COSH) and 56 co-signatories below are glad to see the new enforcement measure has been carried out, so as to provide greater protection to the population. ASP users are advised to take this opportunity to kick the habit for healthier lifestyle.

Given that children and youth are the marketing targets of ASPs, a total ban on ASPs could safeguard the next generation from tobacco temptations in all forms, as well as to curb tobacco epidemic. Mr Henry TONG, COSH Chairman said, "This is an important step forward in the development of Hong Kong tobacco control policies. Not only does it prevent the gateway to smoking through ASPs, but it also motivates smokers to stay tobacco-free. In the long run, the smoking prevalence will drop which helps create favourable condition for implementing tobacco endgame in the future."

An increasing number of researches found that ASPs could release detrimental chemicals and carcinogens. Some chemicals are found to be either present in higher concentration in aerosols of that ASPs or not found in conventional cigarette smoke. The findings from The University of Hong Kong showed that the risk of respiratory symptoms among the adolescent electronic cigarette users and HTP users was higher in exclusive cigarette users. The threat of ASPs to population health must therefore not be ignored.

COSH, together with all sectors of community, will continue to strengthen the publicity and education programmes to remind the public not to purchase ASPs from any channels, publicize the hazards of tobacco and promote smoking cessation. The Government is also recommended to step up enforcement actions for enhancing policy effectiveness. Besides, we urge the Government to strengthen tobacco control effort in the future, in order to further lower the smoking prevalence for progressing towards the goal of tobacco endgame.
